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# Performance analysis of the regional people's representative board of Bengkulu city for the 2019-2024 period in making regional regulations\*

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## Abstract

The aim of this research is to analyze the performance of the Bengkulu metropolitan city DPRD for the 2019-2024 period as a whole in making regional regulations. The information series method used in this research is a qualitative technique with qualitative research techniques. The research results are explained descriptively and analytically. The techniques used are observation, interviews and documentation. This review uses 8 performance indicators taken from several elements of 3 theories of professional opinion and then mixed into indicators for this review. They also examined 10 related informants. There are 7 members of the metropolitan city DPRD, 1 chairman of the metropolitan city DPRD, and 2 people from the metropolitan city DPRD office/Secretariat. The research was carried out at the Bengkulu City DPRD office, party offices and several other public places. The observation time starts from the beginning of the statement, namely December 2020.

## Introduction

Chandler and Plano in Harban (2016), say that Public administration is a procedure in which public resources and personnel are prepared and coordinated to formulate, put into effect, and manage choices in public coverage. Chandler & Plano explained that public administration is an art and technology geared toward dealing with "public affairs" and wearing out numerous assigned responsibilities. Public administration is a scientific subject with objectives to remedy public problems via improvements, especially in the fields of corporations, human assets, and finance.

While in Sirajuddin (2016), Autonomy comes from the phrases *autos* and *nomos*. The primary phrase manner 'on my own at the same time as the second one-word method 'command' so that autonomy manner self-governing.

Because the researcher will talk about the nearby government apparatus, and its method also discusses decentralization. Decentralization is constan-

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tly related to unbiased or self-reliant popularity, so any talk about decentralization uses itself manner talking approximately autonomy.

With a purpose to provide wider space for regions to regulate and control the lives of their citizens, as a way to create a balance among synergistic national interests and nonetheless take note of situations, peculiarities, and nearby know-how inside the management of government as an entire, the valuable authorities in forming guidelines ought to be aware of neighborhood understanding. And vice versa, whilst forming regional policies inside the shape of regional policies or different rules, countrywide interests have to additionally be taken into consideration. The vicinity as a criminal community unit that has autonomy has the authority to modify and manipulate its very own area in keeping with the aspirations and hobbies of the community as long as it does now not conflict with the countrywide legal order and the public interest.

In Tjahjo (2017), the motive of regional autonomy is large as a manifestation of decentralization which has given authority to areas to modify and control their very own Authorities affairs given via the important government to regions, the motive being that the nearby authorities are greater privy to the situations and conditions of their areas.

Article 1 paragraph (1) of the 1945 constitution of the Republic of Indonesia states that: The state of Indonesia is a unitary country within the shape of a Republic. This provision stipulates that the Republic of Indonesia shall no longer be fashioned as a federation, but instead as a unitary country framework. Therefore, the place has the authority to alter and manipulate its household without being separated from the body of the unitary state.

As a regional authority, collectively local heads including governors, mayors, and their body of workers run the authorities, whilst the DPRD or the regional human beings consultant Council will supervise and control the walking of the government inside the areas, administering authorities is assisted by using local apparatus, and together with regional heads draft nearby policies.

Regulation quantity 32 of 2004 concerning nearby government in Article I letter (d) states “nearby government is the organizer of autonomous regional government by using the nearby government and DPRD in step with the precept of Decentralization”. So the regional government is not the Regent/Mayor with the DPRD however is now the position of the Regent/Mayor as the regional executive Board and the DPRD as a local Legislative body which has a robust feature in growing the vision and challenge of the local government in addition to a way for the people to perform supervision (Social control). On the strolling of government (regional government Board) by using the people’s representative body (nearby Legislative body). In carrying out its characteristic as a local Legislative frame, the DPRD has an identical position and is a regional partner. In the meantime, in going for walks as a nearby consultant frame, the DPRD has the proper to maintain the local Head responsible, as conveyed using Wasistiono (2001) which states that: “The DPRD’s function is implicitly better than that of the local head. However, this higher position is not accomplished each day”.

As a public provider issuer or imparting services to the humans, the government along with local heads which includes the Governor, Mayor, DPRD, or regional people’s consultant Council, as well as nearby apparatus, is needed to hold to provide the high-quality provider for the network. The achievement of an employer can’t be separated from its people, in this example DPRD as a legislator is required to have ethics and morals in supplying public services, with a purpose to offer the best carrier for the community.

In step with guys PAN in Abner H.B (2008), the government in providing public services nonetheless has many shortcomings, so after being viewed in terms of high quality, it is miles still a ways from what the network expects. That is indicated by way of the emergence of numerous public proceedings thru the mass media. If this condition isn’t answered by using the government, it’ll create an unfavorable image of the government itself. Given that the main characteristic of the authorities is to serve the network, the authorities desire to retain to enhance the high-quality of public services.



meanwhile, in line with Thoha in Abner H.B (2008) the present-day circumstance of society has passed off a dynamic development, the level of community lifestyles is getting higher, which is an indication of the empowering skills via the community. This means humans are increasingly aware of what are their rights and duties as citizens in living in society, kingdom, and kingdom. Humans are becoming bolder to publish their demands, desires, and aspirations to the government. Society is increasing the number of crucial and greater bravery to work out control over what's being completed using the government.

The local people's consultant Council is a regional human beings consultant organization this is domiciled as a detail of nearby authorities organizers that have roles and responsibilities in figuring out performance, effectiveness, productivity, and accountability of regional authorities administration via the implementation of the rights, responsibilities, responsibilities, authorities, and features of the local human beings' consultant Council according with the provisions of the legislation.

The generation of regional autonomy like the modern-day DPRD has a completely huge position and function inside the implementation of government at the nearby stage. This is due to the fact the DPRD has the proper initiative to shape a local law (Local Regulation). That is by its function as a legislative body, whilst the DPRD turns into the incarnation of the people, the right to the initiative may be very appropriate. Therefore, in principle, the nearby law is the embodiment of the need or will of human beings (Sirajuddin et al, 2006).

This research will recognition on the performance of the Bengkulu city DPRD in making regional regulations for 2019-2024, to offer evaluations for enhancing future performance, which is predicted to have an impact on enhancing better public services for the network.

There are three reasons for selecting the title and research problem. The 3 motives are:

1. The number of regulations made continues to be no longer comparable
2. The variety of local rules at the initiative of the Bengkulu city DPRD continues to be lacking
3. Some guidelines might be still debatable these 3 motives could be described in element separately as under.

### **The number of nearby regulations produced is small**

The Bengkulu town regional regulation is a prison product this is binding and applies to all of us in Bengkulu town. The dearth of regional policies produced with the aid of the Bengkulu town DPRD is also an illustration of issues for the Bengkulu city DPRD. The subsequent is a desk of the quantity of Bengkulu metropolis regulation/regulation products that have been produced for 2019-2020.

### **The number of regional DPRD initiatives in Bengkulu City is small**

In terms of sporting out its duties to make Bengkulu metropolis regional policies, the DPRD has the proper initiative or the proper to post a draft Bengkulu town local regulation. The range of nearby guidelines produced via using incentive rights is still no longer maximized, primarily based on what Kusmito stated in a research interview conducted via Saputra (2021), that, “In 2019 - 2020 there are 8 initiative rights which have been proposed through the councils in consisting of discussing the management of conventional markets, changing names for city Civil Registration Populations, Draft local rules regarding PDAM names, Draft nearby rules regarding RT/RW and others”. However, also stated by using Kusmito all are inside the manner of dialog and features now not been made into regional rules.

The trendy statistics in keeping with the top of the Bengkulu city regional Secretariat in a research interview performed via Saputra (2021), he said that from 2014 to 2020 there were eight Bengkulu city regional guidelines shaped based on the initiative of the Bengkulu city DPRD, particularly: “local law number four of 2014 concerning Implementation lodging business, local law number 4 of 2016 concerning the Welfare of the aged, local regulation wide variety 2 of 2017 regarding the Implementation of disaster management, nearby law wide variety 3 of 2017 regarding the availability of distinct breastfeeding, nearby law quantity 5 of 2017 regarding the availability of criminal help to the community the negative, management of inexperienced open spaces in 2017, regional regulation variety 6 of 2017 regarding economic and administrative rights of leaders and individuals of the Bengkulu city DPRD, and local regulation range 30 of 2018 concerning company social and environmental duty.

### Controversial Local Regulations

On Monday, December 13, 2021, a plenary assembly became held. In the outcomes of the plenary meeting, all individuals of the DPRD gift stated that they agreed that the 8 Draft town government policies were upgraded to turn out to be regional policies (in Toebari, 2021). Of the 8 Draft metropolis Authorities policies, the Draft local law concerning amendments to nearby regulation variety 5 of 2013 concerning Rural and concrete Land and Building Tax (PBB-P2) changed into authorized for adjustment. The adjustment referred to is the Mayor's regulation wide variety 43 of 2019 Bengkulu city.

Parent regulation range 43 of 2019 regarding the classification of fundamental Values of Land and buildings as the basis for the Imposition of duties on the acquisition of Rights on Land and buildings formerly precipitated controversy, because it changed into taken into consideration to increase the income value of Tax items (NJOP) which might later burden the network.

The chairman of the nearby regulation Formation employer of the Bengkulu town DPRD, once said that the revised nearby regulation might stabilize the contents of the mother or father regulation number forty-three of 2019. In it, the basis for calculating the imposition of BPHTB might be written.

This revision of the local law was protested by using the head of the Bengkulu local management association for Land Deed Makers (IPPAT). Because it is taken into consideration that the revision of this regional law is incorrect of course. Revising the regional regulation will simplest prolong the legislative procedure for the imposition of BPHTB due to the fact the revision of regional regulation number 5 of 2013 regarding PBB additionally requires a revision of local law variety 6 of 2011 concerning BPHTB.

The determination of the value of the assessment and resolution of the sales cost of Tax items (NJOP) such as the determination of PBB primarily based on the provisions of the Minister of Finance law number 208 of 2018 is said to have observed the provisions regarding the mapping of the Land value sector (ZNT) issued by the Ministry of ATR/BPN along with the listing of building issue prices (DBKB). ) while this

provision regarding ZNT can be regulated more maximally within the revision of the regional regulation of BPHTB. In any other case, it will create confusion in determining the calculation of BPHTB due to the fact the assessment isn't in sync with the provisions on the ZNT mapping. (A. Ferraro, 2022).

Formerly, the Bengkulu city DPRD nearby law employer reminded the metropolis government now not to burden humans in regards to the modification to nearby regulation range five of 2013 concerning Rural and concrete Land and Building Tax (PBB-P2). This became found out in a discussion meeting at the revision of the nearby law performed by way of the local regulatory authorities enterprise and the Bengkulu city local legislation group, Tuesday thirteen September 2021 (Bengkulu human beings, 2022), however ultimately the Bengkulu town DPRD also permitted the draft of the metropolis government regional law to boom to neighborhood law.

But, on Thursday, January thirteen, 2022, the Governor of Bengkulu revoked the father or mother regulation wide variety forty-three of 2019. This was regarded all through the Synchronization and Coordination meeting of the Governor's role as the representative of the principal authorities led via the nearby Secretary, inside the III floor Meeting Room of the Bengkulu Governor's workplace (Fhd Bengkulu Provincial Government, 2022).

How is the DPRD of Bengkulu town responding to choices from the center, nearby government, and additionally the aspirations of the network in various issues that rise in the town of Bengkulu? Beginning from accepting people's aspirations to making, designing, monitoring, and accepting proposed guidelines. So the researcher formulates the study's trouble as follows: How is the overall performance of the Bengkulu city DPRD in making nearby policies?

The Institute of kingdom management of the Republic of Indonesia abbreviated as LAN-RI (1999:3), formulating overall performance is an outline of the level of success of the implementation of a hobby, application, coverage in realizing the dreams, targets, task, and imaginative and prescient of the agency. The overall performance idea put forward by LAN-RI is extra directed to the overall performance reference of a public business enterprise that is pretty applicable according to the strategy of an agency, particularly the mission and different visions to be completed. (In Harbani. P, 2016).

Know-how the enterprise in keeping with James D. Mooney is all kinds of each affiliation of human beings to reap a commonplace intention. In keeping with John D. Millet, the business enterprise is a structural framework in which the work of numerous people is organized to comprehend a commonplace intention. According to Weigh Waldo, the organization is in the shape of authorities and conducts the courting among humans in an administrative machine. In this examination, the enterprise a way to be studied is the Bengkulu city house of Representatives, as one of the Authority's organizations on the local degree (in Syafie, 2016).

The performance of the DPRD of East Lombok Regency in the process of drafting Regional Regulations has not gone well, because 5 aspects are used in the field for analysis (Wildiani, H. 2021).

To determine the overall performance dimension of the Bengkulu town nearby residence of Representatives business enterprise for the 2019-2024 period in making nearby policies, Bureaucratic Organizational overall performance indicators are wished. Some of the Bureaucratic Organizational overall performance signs are as follows:

Organizational performance indicators in keeping with LAN-RI The willpower of overall performance signs is in line with LAN-RI, that's a manner of identifying and classifying overall performance indicators through a system of gathering and dealing with information or data to determine the overall performance of activities, packages, and/or rules. The willpower of performance signs ought to be primarily based on inputs, outputs, effects, advantages, and influences. As a result, the overall performance signs may be used

to evaluate: (1) the starting stage, (2) the implementation degree, and (3) the degree after the activity is completed and functioning.

As for the matters that need to be considered in determining overall performance signs, specifically: (1) particular and clear, (2) can be measured objectively both qualitatively and quantitatively, (3) can show the fulfillment of outputs, results, blessings and affects, (4) must be flexible and sensitive sufficient to trade, and (5) effective, this is, statistics can be accrued, processed and analyzed successfully and successfully.

Organizational Performance Indicators According to Robbins, In line with Robbin's (2016: 260) performance, signs are tools to measure the quantity to which employee overall performance is completed. The subsequent are a few signs to degree worker performance: (1) nice of work; (2) amount; (3) Punctuality; (4) Effectiveness; (5) Independence.

The performance of participants of the central Bengkulu Regency DPRD in wearing out the function of supervising local regulations via established mechanisms, namely via painting conferences, going to the field to check to monitor gadgets, and synchronizing making plans documents and implementation files. Supervision carried out with the aid of participants of the relevant Bengkulu Regency DPRD changed into accomplished after the exit coverage. The form of local regulation supervision carried out by participants of the imperative Bengkulu Regency DPRD is to without delay monitor the sector, concentrate on community entry, and listen together to carry out the supervisory function of existing policies. The barriers confronted by way of DPRD individuals in wearing out their supervisory capabilities are the topography of central Bengkulu which is hard to reach, technical constraints, lack of transparency, and openness of the nearby authorities. (Hardi, H., Saputra, H., & Asnawati, A. 2018).

DPRD, part of the local government, has legislative, budgetary, and supervisory features. The DPRD's duties normatively talk to the reflection of democratic life in nearby government today as a medium of cheek and balance. However, is it viable for the DPRD to be effective in wearing out its supervisory obligations and functions, thinking that it's miles a part of the regional authorities? To answer these troubles, it is vital to behavior felony research with a normative felony method supported through information inside the shape of policies, felony ideas, and critiques from leading pupils. (Santoso, M. A. 2011).

The DPRD's supervisory role ambitions to make sure that all public regulations associated with the financial cycle are implemented according to applicable legal guidelines and policies and are orientated toward public priorities. Amid the Covid-19 outbreak, budgeting and budget management now do not go through the dialogue mechanism in the DPRD this is usually finished. This is due to the fact the regulation instead of a law (Peru) for coping with the Corona Virus makes the nearby government (Pemda) the authority to adjust the budget at will. To make sure, the capacity for misuse of the country's finances in dealing with the Covid-19 outbreak is susceptible to occur. (Taufiqurrahman, M., Wong Chun Sen, 2020).

The implementation of supervision over the implementation of the APBD of Sleman Regency is carried out by (1) determining the equipment, (2) direct supervision of programs in the field to find out whether there are deviations, (3) Absorbing aspirations with the community whether during recess or not, (4) evaluating executive budget accountability report; (5) Budget monitoring as an evaluation of funded programs, and (6) Actively involved in regional budget discussions and synchronization and correlation of the previous budget year and evaluation of program results/achievements/performance as service-related programs. (Tunggal, Alfine. 2013).

The Palu metropolis regional people's consultant Council, as a companion of the nearby authorities in carrying out development, needs to have a good overall performance in sporting out its responsibilities, one all that's making local regulations. (Ishak, 2013).

The implementation of the legislative features of the DPRD, inclusive of: a. DPRD performance in the mechanism for drafting nearby policies (Perda), b. variety of proposed nearby policies, c. nearby policies on



government and legislative projects, d. Perda ordinary and rejected, e. elements influencing the performance of DPRD in making local regulations (Perda). (Dominggus, Idhan. 2017).

## Research methods

This research uses a qualitative research method design. According to Bogdan and Taylor, qualitative methodology is a research procedure that produces descriptive data in the form of written or spoken words from people and observed behavior. This approach is directed at the background and individual in a holistic (whole) manner. So in this case it is not permissible to isolate individuals or organizations into variables or hypotheses, but it is necessary to view them as part of a whole (Moleong, 2006:3).

The data sources for this research are 7 members of the City DPRD, Chair of the Bengkulu City DPRD, Head of the Secretariat of the Bengkulu City DPRD, Head of the legal sector of the Bengkulu City Government, a total of 10 people. They will be conducted in-depth interviews. To obtain information and data in the form of sentences and real images, in this research the researcher used a qualitative method with a descriptive research type. The qualitative method is a process of searching for data to understand social problems that is based on comprehensive research, formed by words, and obtained from natural situations. This research has a qualitative approach, which aims to find out how the Bengkulu City DPRD performs for the 2019-2024 period in forming regional regulations which will be analyzed according to qualitative research methods, taking into account a number of data that will be obtained in the field.

The author used a qualitative research method design because the researcher wanted to describe the quality of the performance and achievements of the Bengkulu City DPRD in making laws. Research was carried out by means of observation, interviews and documentation, primary and secondary data sources.

Researchers searched for secondary data through supporting data and reports as well as supporting theories. Then search for primary data by directly observing the subjects and objects studied, conducting in-depth interviews, collecting data including primary data. Researchers document the results of observations as data. Then look for documents that are related and can support the research being carried out. The results of the observations, interviews and documentation were then presented by the researcher and developed in written form and discussed with the theory used.

The research focus in this study is: 1) Determining the research focus can limit the study, in this case the focus will limit the field of inquiry, research does not need to go here and there to look for the subject because it is limited by the focus. 2) Determining focus also functions to fulfill the inclusion-exclusion criteria or inclusion-exclusion criteria for information newly obtained in the field.

Data collection carried out in this research was observation, interviews, documentation, visual material methods and online data search methods. The existing data was analyzed using words and sentences to obtain maximum results in accordance with the research objectives, namely to analyze the performance of the Bengkulu City People's Representative Council for the 2019-2024 period in making Regional Regulations.

## Results and discussion

Researchers will provide an explanation of the research results and discussions that have been carried out by researchers when conducting research about. Analysis of the Performance of the Bengkulu City Regional People's Representative Council for the 2019-2024 Period in Making Regional Regulations. The



explanation given is an explanation of the existing problem formulation. The results of this research are as follows:

## 2 Technology

The Secretary of the Bengkulu City DPRD said that the DPRD Secretariat had prepared 4 rooms equipped with audio-visual and network equipment to facilitate the online Plenary Meeting process. The 4 rooms will be occupied by DPRD Leaders and Members as well as the DPRD Expert Team. Meanwhile, the Chairman of the Bengkulu City DPRD emphasized that in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, the duties and functions of the DPRD's authority must continue to run well. "Because they have supervisory, budget and legislative duties, even in the context of the corona virus pandemic," he concluded.

## 3 Technical guidance

The Bengkulu City DPRD Secretariat has prepared a budget of around IDR 175 million for Technical Guidance (Bimtek) for 35 elected council members for the 2019-2024 period. The implementation of this technical guidance is scheduled for September 30 – October 3 2019. "The implementation of Bimtek already has a budget item, around IDR 5 million per council member," said the Acting City Secretary (Plt),

yesterday (11/9). Bimtek or education and training (Diklat) is carried out only once, and follows the schedule of the Provincial Government because it is carried out simultaneously. “For the location, we will see the invitation from the province, but the place is in a hotel, and it will only be done once,” he explained. For your information, this Technical Guidance for DPRD members is an educational and training activity related to DPRD duties with the aim of increasing the knowledge, insight and skills of DPRD members and DPRD Secretariat members in order to increase professional and competent performance within the DPRD and regional government. In general, there are at least 15 materials that board members must study so they don’t make mistakes at work. This material includes procedures for preparation and management as well as the financial accounting process for the DPRD and the DPRD Secretariat. Then, the role of Banmus, Balegda, and the Honorary Body in improving the performance of the DPRD, orientation on managing recess funds for DPRD members, optimizing the duties and responsibilities of DPRD equipment, optimizing DPRD recesses & main ideas, training on optimizing the role of DPRD in planning and evaluating regional development performance, then optimize the role of the DPRD in budgeting and supervision as well as making regional regulations as well as optimizing the function and authority of the DPRD in the process of preparing and determining the APBD.

## 4 Funding

### Organization’s funding sources

Bengkulu City Government funding is based on Bengkulu City APBD funds. Bengkulu City APBD projections for 2019 to 2023 are explained in the following table:

The percentage level of regional regulations passed based on the Propemperda (Bappemperda), which was discussed by members of the Bengkulu City DPRD together with the executive, has only been reached 40.90% or 68.17% of the target of 60% based on the DPA for Amendments to the Secretariat of the Bengkulu City DPRD Number: 27/DPA/BPKAD/ 2020 on October 20 2020 Budget amounting to IDR 61,083,652,196.00. The amount of funds above is allocated for Indirect Expenditures for the DPRD Secretariat amounting to IDR 21,866,990,000.00 and Direct Expenditures for the DPRD Secretariat IDR 38,988,524,496.00. The indirect budget realization up to 31 December 2020 was IDR 19,996,954,803.00, and direct expenditure up to 31 December 2020 was IDR 36,639,452,710.00. The total budget realization up to 31 December 2020 was IDR 56,636,407,513.00.

## 2. CHAPTER II AMOUNT OF THE INTENSIVE COMMUNICATIONS ALLOWANCE OF THE REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL OF BENGKULU CITY

The Intensive Communication Allowance for Leaders and Members of the Bengkulu City Regional People's Representative Council is calculated based on the Regional Financial Capability of the Medium Group, with a formula of 5 (five) times the representation money for the Chairman of the Regional People's Representative Council.

The amount of the Intensive Communication Allowance as referred to in paragraph (1) is  $5 \times \text{Rp. } 2,100,000.00 = \text{Rp. } 10,500,000.00$  (Ten million five hundred thousand rupiah) and paid monthly.

## 3. CHAPTER III RECESS BENEFITS FOR LEADERS AND MEMBERS OF REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL

### Section 4

The recess allowance for leaders and members of the Bengkulu City Regional People's Representative Council is calculated based on the Regional Financial Capability of the Medium Group, with a formula of 5 (five) times the representation money for the Chairman of the Regional People's Representative Council.

The amount of the Recess Allowance as referred to in paragraph (1) is  $5 \times \text{Rp. } 2,100,000.00 = \text{Rp. } 10,500,000.00$  (Ten million five hundred thousand rupiah) and is paid every time the activity is recessed.

## 4. CHAPTER IV OPERATIONAL FUNDS FOR THE LEADER OF THE REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL

### Section 5

Operational funds for the Chairman of the Regional People's Representative Council of Bengkulu City are calculated based on the Regional Financial Capability of the Medium Group of Bengkulu City using the formula 4 times the representative money of the Chairman of the Regional People's Representative Council of Bengkulu City.

The amount of Operational Funds for the Chairman of the Regional People's Representative Council as referred to in paragraph (1) is  $4 \times 2,100,000.00 = \text{Rp. } 8,400,000.00$  (Eight million four hundred thousand rupiah).

### Section 6

Operational funds for the Deputy Chair of the Regional People's Representative Council of Bengkulu City are calculated based on the Regional Financial Capability of the Medium Group of Bengkulu City using the formula 2.5 times the representative money of the Deputy Chair of the Regional People's Representative Council of Bengkulu City.

The amount of Operational Funds for the Deputy Chair of the Regional People's Representative Council as referred to in paragraph (1) is  $2.5 \times 1,680,000.00 = \text{Rp. } 4,200,000.00$  (Four million two hundred thousand rupiah).

### Section 7

Providing operational funds as intended in article 5 is carried out every month with the following conditions:

80% (eighty percent) is given at once for all costs or is called a lump sum; and 20% (twenty percent) is given for other operational funding support.

## 1 Effectiveness

### Vision, Mission, Targets of the Bengkulu City DPRD

An important key to the success of regional government administration is determined, among other things, by the ability of the Regional Government and the Regional People's Representative Council (DPRD) to carry out their duties and authority, a synergistic relationship between the two, central and regional relations, as well as constructive inter-regional relations. So it is important to know the policy direction of the Bengkulu City Government. Together with the City Government, the Bengkulu City DPRD will strive to realize the vision, mission and targets of the Bengkulu City Government.

In accordance with the mandate of Minister of Home Affairs Regulation Number 86 of 2017 concerning Procedures for Planning, Controlling and Evaluation of Regional Development, Procedures for Evaluation of Draft Regional Regulations concerning Regional Long-Term Development Plans and Regional Medium-Term Development Plans, as well as Procedures for Amendments to Regional Long-Term Development Plans, Regional Medium Term Development Plans, and Regional Government Work Plans. The RKPD is prepared based on the policy direction and main targets to be achieved at the next stage in the RPJPD. Therefore, for 2020 the planning process for the City of Bengkulu is based on the third development stage of the Regional Long Term Development Plan (RPJPD) for the City of Bengkulu for 2007-2027.

The main targets to be achieved in the third phase of the RPJMD of the 2007-2027 Bengkulu City RPJPD are as follows:

1. Increasing the competitiveness of the City and Bengkulu Human Resources (HR) competitively as well as continuing to increase technological knowledge capabilities,
2. Strengthening economic independence and regional competitiveness, and
3. Improving community welfare through increasing per capita income, reducing poverty and unemployment rates, improving health status and reducing community welfare. disparities in welfare between community groups.

Based on efforts to achieve these targets, the 2020 Bengkulu City RKPD contains the theme "realizing efficient use of various resources in regional development to improve community welfare" and this theme also adapts to the RKP theme "Increasing Human Resources for Quality Growth"

As a form of implementation of Government Regulation number 12 of 2019 concerning Regional Financial Management, Minister of Home Affairs Regulation number 70 of 2020 concerning Regional Government Information Systems and Minister of Home Affairs Regulation number 90 of 2019 concerning Classification, Codification and Regional Finance have been issued. Development Planning Nomenclature Then, in line with this, a circular letter from the Minister of Home Affairs number 130/736/SJ was issued regarding the Acceleration of Implementation of Regional Government Information Systems which instructed Regional Governments to carry out mapping of the nomenclature of programs and activities in the RPJMD in accordance with Minister of Home Affairs Regulation number 90 In 2019, the mapping results were used as a reference in preparing the RKPD.



## **2 Quality of Service**

### **Level of Community Satisfaction**

According to the mass media, there have been no complaints from the public against the Bengkulu City DPRD. Based on other public spaces such as recesses, inspections and hearings, it was found that public enthusiasm for having their aspirations heard is still quite high.

There are many complaints and problems that the public has complained to the Bengkulu City DPRD. Apart from the fact that the public needs to be heard, the public's need for the Bengkulu City DPRD indicates that public satisfaction is still quite high with the Bengkulu City DPRD.

### **3 Responsibility**

#### **Standard**

The standard used by the Bengkulu City DPRD in making regional regulations is Bengkulu City Regional People's Representative Council Regulation No. 1 of 2019 concerning the Rules of Procedure of the Bengkulu City Regional People's Representative Council.

### **4 Responsiveness**

#### **a. Recess**

The 2021 Second Recess activities which are scheduled from 25 to 27 September 2021 will be carried out by all Bengkulu City DPRD Members - totaling 35 (thirty five) people and divided based on the Electoral District (Dapil) of each Bengkulu City DPRD Member. Electoral District I Muara Bangkahulu, Teluk Segara and Sungai Serut Districts Electoral District II Selebar and Kampung Melayu Districts Electoral District III Gading Cempaka and Singaran Pati Districts Electoral District IV Ratu Agung and Ratu Samban Districts. The implementation is carried out in groups and individuals in sub-districts and sub-districts in Bengkulu City according to their respective Electoral Districts and accompanied by the Bengkulu City DPRD Secretariat, which is carried out with an Assignment Order.

It is hoped that the results of the Bengkulu City DPRD Recess activities can become recommendations to be followed up in Bengkulu City DPRD Commission meetings with related partners, especially in carrying out the function of forming Regional Regulations. budget and supervision

Incoming aspirations in the form of proposals for physical development and other activities are accommodated in the preparation of the Bengkulu City RKPD which then becomes material for the preparation of the APBD both in the preparation of the APBD for the next fiscal year and in changes to the APBD.

From the activities of the Second Recess in 2021, input/aspirations were obtained from the people in the electoral districts of each Bengkulu City DPRD Member from various aspects including Government, Development, Social Welfare, Security and Order, Education, Social Culture, Health and Hygiene. So that this Second Recess activity does not just become a formal activity, the results of the recess above must be "followed up by the Bengkulu City Government" so that they are useful in the development and welfare of the community, especially the people of Bengkulu City.

All community aspirations conveyed through meetings in each electoral district are accommodated and submitted to the regional government to be followed up based on authority and priority scale. "The recess aims to capture community aspirations so that development proposals are more optimal and felt directly by the community to improve better welfare.

From the proposals submitted by the community in accordance with the authority so that they can be budgeted through APBD funds. The Bengkulu City Government and their respective work units should be able to follow up with serious attention. So that the community feels that the programs proposed through

their representatives are truly realized and beneficial to the community, in order to achieve government programs that are effective and on target.

Community aspirations resulting from the recess received by DPRD members will be followed up as material for preparing the Bengkulu City RKPD and in general. The aspirations of the people from several Electoral Districts have been summarized in the DPRD Recess to become DPRD Principles of Thought and as input in the preparation of the Bengkulu City APBD based on applicable laws and regulations.

## **b. Check it out**

### **1. Inspection and Gathering with Commission 1 of the Bengkulu City DPRD at the CCTV Monitoring Center**

Monday morning (20/01) Commission 1 of the Bengkulu City DPRD carried out an inspection and gathering in the context of the CCTV Monitoring Center in Bengkulu City at the Bengkulu City Communication, Informatics and Encryption Service.

### **2. Inspection, Inspection, Chairman of the Bengkulu City DPRD Checks Preparations for Health Services at HD Hospital**

To ensure that the people of Bengkulu City receive services that meet standards, Wednesday (18/3) morning, the Chairman of the Bengkulu City DPRD carried out unannounced inspections (Sidak) at a number of public service locations.

The places investigated included the Hope and Prayer Hospital (RSHD), the National Education Service, the Health Service (Dinkes) and entertainment venues such as malls in Bengkulu City. The chairman of the Bengkulu City DPRD said this activity was carried out to follow up on the mayor's appeal regarding anticipating the spread of Covid-19 (Coronavirus Disease 2019) in Bengkulu City.

"Following up on the mayor's appeal, we went to the field and visited the Health Service, Education Service, and hospitals in response to the appeal. We want to know from this appeal what the next steps are being taken, as at the Department of Education, currently school children are being closed, what are the next steps from the department. Was there any spraying or something? "For hospitals, what kind of readiness is there to deal with the spread of the virus," he said.

The City DPRD, he continued, is ready to support the steps taken by each department to tackle the spread of Covid-19. Such as the readiness of the Health Service to prepare hand sanitizer equipment in public places and services.

### **3. Inspection, Barendo City of Bengkulu Again Investigated by the Council**

The Deputy Chair of the Bengkulu City DPRD together with members of the Bengkulu City DPRD today (21/07) carried out an inspection/inspection at the Bengkulu City Square (Barendo) Construction Site which is located around the At-Taqwa Mosque, Anggut Atas Village, Bengkulu City. In this inspection, the Council questioned the progress of the development of Beremndo (Alun-alun) in Bengkulu City.

### **4. Inspection, Commission 2 Inspection TWA Long Beach**

Commission 2 of the Bengkulu City DPRD accompanied by the Deputy Chair of the Bengkulu City DPRD and the NGOs Gema Wasbi, Kanopi and Walhi Bengkulu this morning (16/07) carried out inspections and investigations at the construction site of the Ari Beach tourist area which is located in the Long Beach Bengkulu TWA.

The Chairman of Commission 2 said that this investigation was intended to collect detailed data and information, identify the problems that occurred and diagnose the main problems that occurred. Furthermore, Indra Sukma said that in the near future his party would gather related parties in a Hearing Meeting at the Bengkulu City DPRD.

## **5. Inspection, Commission 2 found that the quality of the road work was not good**

Bengkulu City DPRD Commission 2 started 2021 by getting straight to work. This morning until this afternoon (04/01), Commission 2, led by the Chair of Commission 2, conducted a review of several Bengkulu City road improvement activities carried out in the previous fiscal year.

Some of the roads being reviewed are improvements to the 2-lane Padang Serai road and improvements to the Bangkahan road, Teluk Sepang sub-district. On the Padang Serai road section, Commission 2 found road work that was deemed not to meet the standards for road improvement work, such as poor asphalt quality and inappropriate asphalt thickness. In fact, the construction of the Package II road used West Java and Banten Bank loan funds worth IDR 38 billion.

### **b. Hearing and Meeting**

#### **1. Commission 2 Hearing with PLN**

Commission 2 and Commission 3 of the Bengkulu City DPRD, Monday (06/07) held a Hearing Meeting with PT. PLN PERSERO BENGKULU following complaints from the people of Bengkulu City regarding the increase in electricity bills. This hearing was chaired by the Deputy Chair of the Bengkulu City DPRD.

#### **2. Commission 2 Facilitates Hearings on Zone 2 Parking Zone Polemic**

Commission II of the Bengkulu City DPRD today (07/07) facilitated a hearing and held a hearing in order to find a solution regarding the zone 2 parking lot conflict. The meeting was chaired by the Chairman of Commission II Indra Sukma Samosir and attended by the Head of the Transportation Department, the Head of Bapenda and the Parking Manager.

#### **3. Discussing the Pagar Dewa Market, Commission II asks the City Government to prepare legal measures**

Commission II of the Bengkulu City DPRD held a hearing with a number of Regional Apparatus Organizations (OPD) of the Bengkulu City Government, Tuesday, February 25 2020. The hearing was related to the parking issue at Pagar Dewa Market, where based on the decision of the Supreme Court (MA) parking management was restored to the Wijaya Bangun Cooperative.

Commission II assesses that the status of market management, including parking management, is still status quo, so that the Bangun Wijaya Cooperative cannot manage it before obtaining permission from the city government. Commission II also asked Assistant I, Head of Government and Legal Affairs to learn more about Pagar Dewa Market.

### **c. Sidak**

#### **1. Sidak dan Silaturahmi Komisi 1 DPRD Kota Bengkulu ke Monitoring Center CCTV**

Senin pagi (20/01) Komisi 1 DPRD Kota Bengkulu melaksanakan Sidak dan Silaturahmi dalam rangka Monitoring Center CCTV di Kota Bengkulu ke Dinas Komunikasi, Informatik dan Persandian Kota Bengkulu.

#### **2. Sidak, Sidak, Ketua DPRD Kota Bengkulu Periksa Persiapan Pelayanan Kesehatan di RS HD**

Untuk memastikan masyarakat Kota Bengkulu mendapatkan pelayanan yang sesuai standar, Rabu (18/3) pagi, Ketua DPRD Kota Bengkulu, melakukan sidak inspeksi mendadak (Sidak) kesejumlah tempat pelayanan publik.

Tempat yang disidak antara lain, Rumah Sakit Harapan dan Doa (RSHD), Dinas Pendidikan Nasional, Dinas Kesehatan (Dinkes) serta tempat hiburan seperti mall di Kota Bengkulu. Ketua DPRD Kota Bengkulu mengatakan kegiatan ini dilakukan guna menindak lanjuti imbauan wali kota terkaitantisipasi penyebaran covid-19 (Coronavirus Disease 2019) di Kota Bengkulu.

“Menindak lanjuti imbauan walikota maka kita turun ke lapangan kita kunjungi Dinas Kesehatan, Dinas Pendidikan, serta rumah sakit seperti apa menanggapi imbauan tersebut. Kita ingin mengetahui dari imbauan tersebut apa langkah selanjutnya yang diperbuat seperti di Dinas Pendidikan saat ini anak sekolah diliburkan apakah langkah selanjutnya dari dinas tersebut. Apakah ada penyemprotan atau apa. Untuk di rumah sakit seperti apa kesiapan dalam menghadapi penyebaran virus tersebut,” ungkapnya.

### **4. Sidak, Komisi 2 Sidak TWA Pantai panjang**

Komisi 2 DPRD Kota Bengkulu didampingi Wakil Ketua DPRD Kota Bengkulu beserta LSM Gema Wasbi, Kanopi dan Walhi Bengkulu pagi tadi (16/07) melakukan sidak dan investigasi di lokasi pembangunan kawasan wisata Pantai Ari yang terletak di TWA Pantai Panjang Bengkulu.

Ketua Komisi 2 mengatakan investigasi ini dimaksudkan untuk mengumpulkan data dan informasi secara mendetail, mengidentifikasi permasalahan yang terjadi dan mendiagnosis permasalahan utama yang terjadi. Komisi 2 DPRD Kota Bengkulu mengawali tahun 2021 dengan langsung bekerja. Pagi hingga siang tadi (04/01), Komisi 2 yang dikomandoi Ketua Komisi 2 melakukan peninjauan terhadap beberapa kegiatan peningkatan ruas jalan Kota Bengkulu yang dilaksanakan pada tahun anggaran sebelumnya.

Beberapa ruas jalan yang ditinjau adalah peningkatan ruas jalan 2 jalur Padang Serai dan peningkatan ruas jalan Bangkahan kelurahan Teluk Sepang. Di ruas jalan Padang Serai, Komisi 2 menemukan pekerjaan jalan yang dinilai tidak sesuai standar pengerjaan peningkatan jalan, seperti kualitas aspal yang kurang baik dan ketebalan aspal yang tidak tepat. Padahal pengerjaan jalan paket II ini menggunakan dana pinjaman Bank Jabar dan Banten senilai Rp 38 Miliar.

## **d. Hearing dan Pertemuan**

### **1. Komisi 2 Hearing dengan PLN**

Komisi 2 dan Komisi 3 DPRD Kota Bengkulu, Senin (06/07) menggelar Rapat Dengar Pendapat bersama ga PT. PLN PERSERO BENGKULU menyusul adanya Pengaduan Masyarakat Kota Bengkulu terkait dengan kenaikan tagihan listrik. Rapat dengar pendapat ini dipimpin oleh Wakil Ketua DPRD Kota Bengkulu.

### **2. Komisi 2 Fasilitas Audiensi Polemik Zona Parkir Zona 2**

Komisi II DPRD Kota Bengkulu hari ini (07/07) memfasilitasi Audiensi dan Menggelar Rapat Dengar Pendapat dalam rangka mencari solusi terkait konflik lahan parkir zona 2. Rapat dipimpin Ketua Komisi II Indra Sukma Samosir dan dihadiri oleh Kadis Perhubungan, Kepala Bapenda dan Pengelola Parkir.

### **3. Bahas Pasar Pagar Dewa, Komisi II Minta Pemkot Siapkan Upaya Hukum**

Komisi II DPRD Kota Bengkulu menggelar rapat dengar pendapat atau hearing dengan sejumlah Organisasi Perangkat Daerah (OPD) Pemerintah Kota Bengkulu, Selasa, 25 Februari 2020. Hearing terkait

persoalan parkir di Pasar Pagar Dewa, di mana berdasarkan putusan Mahkamah Agung (MA) pengelolaan parkir dikembalikan ke Koperasi Bangun Wijaya.

Komisi II menilai status pengelolaan pasar termasuk pengelolaan parkir masih status quo, sehingga Koperasi Bangun Wijaya belum bisa mengelolanya sebelum mendapat izin dari pemkot. Komisi II juga meminta Asisten I, Kabag Pemerintahan dan Hukum untuk mempelajari lebih lanjut perihal Pasar Pagar Dewa.

## 5 Accountability

Chairman of the Bengkulu City DPRD Suprianto Suprianto accompanied by Deputy Chairman I Marliadi Donga Mark and Deputy Chairman II Alamsyah Alamsyah M TPD opened the plenary meeting with the main agenda of conveying the General Views of the Bengkulu City DPRD Fractions regarding the Introduction of the Bengkulu Mayor's Financial Note on the Bengkulu City RAPBD for Fiscal Year 2022.

In this meeting, Suprianto invited each faction to convey and submit a report on their faction's general views, starting from the PAN faction which was read by Kusmito Gunawan, the Gerindra faction which was read by Fatmawati Hamtiani, the PKS faction which was read by H. Muryadi M Rejab, the Golkar Party faction. read by Sutardi Aba Ku, Democratic Party Faction read by Elvin Yanuar S, Hanura Party Faction read by Bambang Hermanto Bams Ha, Nasdem Party Faction read by Hj. Baidari Citra Dewi, the PKB Faction read by Jaya Marta Dang Jhon, and the United Struggle Faction read by H. Ariyono Gumay.

In general, the general view of the DPRD factions emphasizes that the 2022 Fiscal Year APBD must provide stimulus to restore the economy and that the budget and activities in the OPD should be carried out efficiently.

The PAN faction, among other things, asked the City Government to complete a free vaccination program using a door to door system and involving the TNI and Polri. The Gerindra faction asked the City Government to be more proactive in obtaining funds from the center to progress the development of Bengkulu City. The PKS faction asked the City Government to revoke Perwal Number 43 of 2019 concerning Acquisition Costs for Land and Buildings because it is a recommendation from the Budget Agency regarding the KUA and PPAS of the Bengkulu City APBD for the 2022 Fiscal Year.

Meanwhile, the Golkar faction focuses on the RAPBD which should refer to the RPJMD which has been mutually agreed and determined because it is a medium-term regional development document. The Democratic Party faction asked the City Government to request assistance from the PUPR Ministry to normalize and manage the Bengkulu River, which frequently floods. The Hanura Party faction asked the City Government to take steps to restore the economy in Bengkulu City due to the Covid 19 pandemic.

Meanwhile, the Nasdem faction agreed that the RAPBD would be discussed at the next level. The PKB faction asked the City Government to really implement the programs contained in the RPJMD and pay more attention to the welfare of the community. And the United Struggle Faction asked the City Government to evaluate the formation of the Bengkulu City Acceleration Team which spent around IDR 1.5 billion for salary payments, so that the United Struggle Faction cannot yet approve the Mayor's Financial Note on the RAPBD for Fiscal Year 2022 until the City Government can explain the matters that the Faction has noted. Unity of Struggle.

Before closing the plenary meeting, the Chairman of the DPRD said that the general view of the factions was a space to provide input and function from the Bengkulu City DPRD regarding sustainable regional development policies.



## Efforts to Settle Controversial Laws

### Perwal Polemic, Council Presents Solution

The Bengkulu City DPRD held a hearing or hearing meeting with the REI DPD and the Bengkulu City Revenue Agency (Bapenda), Monday, March 9 2020. Regarding Bengkulu Mayor Regulation (Perwal) Number 43 of 2019 concerning Classification of the Basic Value of Land and Buildings as a Basis for Imposing Acquisition Fees Rights to Land and Buildings (BPHTB) which were determined on August 23 2019.

Apart from being unreasonable and outside the norm, this regulation is also considered to be a burden on the public, because the increase in BPHTB reached 300 to 500%. As stated by Yudi Darmawansyah as Chairman of the Bengkulu City DPD REI Real Estate Companies Association.

DPD REI itself previously submitted a request for a hearing to express its aspirations regarding objections to the issuance of this regulation. Yang then appreciated the DPRD for responding to their complaints, by asking the executive to review or revise the regulation.

The reason is, the implementation of this guardianship has an impact on the possibility that DPD REI will not be able to build housing because of the high BPHTB value which has increased by 300 to 500 percent. In fact, DPD REI is one of the tax objects that has the largest contribution as a contributor to Original Regional Income (PAD) from the housing sector.

Nevertheless, DPD REI is still positive about the issuance of this regulation. Because what was presented to the mayor were finished goods, and the relevant stakeholders explained that this was in accordance with the applicable mechanisms and regulations

### Revision of PBB P2 Regional Regulation, Bapemperda: NJOP Must Be Fair and Proportional

Bengkulu City DPRD Bapemperda together with the Regional Legislative Team and technical OPD today (01/11) continued discussions on the Draft Regional Regulation on Amendments to Regional Regulation Number 5 of 2013 concerning Urban and Rural Land and Building Tax (Perda PBB P2). Deputy Chairman of Bapemperda Imran Hanafi said that in principle the Council agreed with the change in the PBB amount of 0.08% of the NJOP, because there had been no adjustment in the PBB amount for quite a long time. Imran also reminded Bapenda to update the NJOP amount or land value zone based on the location of the building/land in question, so that there are no complaints in the community.

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
